January 17, 2023

Present: Mayor Joan Collins, Deputy Mayor Leni Binder, Trustees Ronald Kates, Yaacov Levine, and Louis Saperstein.

Also Present: Attorney Jeffrey Kaplan, Brenda Cohn, and Myra Bennett.

Mayor Collins opened the meeting at 12:30 pm.

A motion was presented by Trustee Saperstein, seconded by Trustee Binder, to accept the Minutes of January 3, 2023, as presented. Unanimous.

A motion was presented by Trustee Kates, seconded by Trustee Binder, to pay bills on General Fund Abstract in the amount of \$33,351.16. Water Fund Abstract in the amount of \$8,001.08, and Sewer Fund Abstract in the amount of \$25,413.98. Unanimous.

There were no public comments.

Myra Bennett reported that the Sullivan Fresh Market would like to change their hours to 2:30 – 4:00 pm on Wednesdays for the 2023 summer season, the Village Board agreed with the time change.

A motion was presented by Trustee Binder, seconded by Trustee Saperstein, to approve Mayor Collins to sign the Inter-Municipal Agreement with the County of Sullivan to collect unpaid Village Taxes; resolution attached, the motion passed as follows:

Attorney Kaplan has sent the proper contract to the Town of Fallsburg as they were working from a contract for Davos; that did not involve the Village of Woodridge. There will be a meeting between the Village and the Town to discuss the Davos Contract on January 20, 2023.

Brenda Cohn reported that there are three properties in the Village being sent to the County for foreclosure proceedings.

Mayor Collins reported that the Water & Sewer Plants are running well.

There was a discussion regarding Culvert 39 (Bridge), the new weight limit signs “10 Tons” have been posted. Will Illing and Barton & Loguidice are looking into the cost of repair.
